<u>Vicar's Message</u>

Ephesians 6:1-2

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother"--which is the first commandment with a promise--



On January 16, 2013, CNN reported "President Barack

Obama on Wednesday proposed background checks on all gun sales and bans on military style assault weapons and high-capacity magazines as part of a package of steps to reduce gun violence in the wake of the Newtown school massacre last month."

According to a survey, 55% of Americans generally favor stricter gun control laws, with 56% saying that it's currently too easy to buy guns in this country. However, only 39% say that stricter gun controls would reduce gun violence all by themselves.

What do people achieve by going into a school and shooting children dead? There may be reasons for the gunman to do this and kill himself. Criminal behavior among children has its roots in habitual deprivation of parental love and affection. The corrective action must start with family values. The relationship between parents has a powerful effect on children from their younger age. Children react to quarreling parents by disobeying, and expressing antisocial behaviors. Quarreling parents mostly vent their anger on their children. Parental hostility and physical and emotional abuse of the child shapes the future criminal.

Every 45 seconds a marriage ends in our country. With it ends not only a covenant of love, but also the stability of a home, financial solidity, and a model of committed love for children to take into their own marriage. Committed marriages establish solid families which build strong communities. Where marriages are committed to serving Christ and each other, relationships flourish.

For a growing child, the happiest and most tranquil family situation is the intact

nature of marriage. From a dysfunctional family, the possibility to have an irresponsible child is much higher. Broken family atmosphere diverts the attention of the child to criminal behavior. The different types of bad things a teenager can easily involve may be alcohol, drug use, poor academic performance, violence in different ways, out of wedlock births, sexually transmitted diseases etc.

The real root causes of violent crimes are unstable, dysfunctional families. We as a church and a community have major responsibility to build up intact families where Jesus is present in all their happiness and sorrow. Parents should be their role models in the religious and secular lives. Children grown up in the families who give importance to Christian values will reduce violence and murder.

This Christmas day, I visited some very elderly people and a lady who has always been confined to a wheelchair. They could not go to church or take part in any Christmas celebrations. The warmth and love with which they received me filled me with light and hope. I was inspired and humbled by the great joy and hope they radiated in spite of their illness, old age and disability. This was their precious Christmas gift to me. No celebration , no festive dinner , no company of friends could give me that quality of pure joy and delight that I received from them.

My Hurricane Sandy Experience

Hurricane Sandy was a terrifying experience. Many people suffered as trees were uprooted, the wind gusted strongly, and rain fell hard. Many people, like me, lost power and some still do not have power yet. Some lost their houses entirely; a few even lost their lives, due to this angry tempest.

Although my house is still standing and my loved ones and I are fine, my experiences were horrible. On Monday night the power went out, so there was no heat, light, or water for many days. The gusts of winds and torrents of rain scared me and let my thoughts run wildly into horrible possibilities. The wind frightened me the most; it seemed to fill the trees with an evil spirit causing them to shake violently with fear of falling over. The rain reminded me of shattering glass, its constant crashing refusing to let me rest. My only solace was the candlelight and my family around me.

We are an extended family so living in our house had become impossible. My aunt, uncle, and cousins shifted to my aunt's sister's house. My parents, grand-parents, sister, and I moved into a hotel. Thus, a house once full of color and life was now a cold and barren wasteland.

I have grown much attached to my house; the memories made there have made it into my home, a place I will never forget. Being away from my home and my family was unbearable, but I thank God, for this horribleness lasted only a week. On Sunday, our power came back, and a cold house became a home again.

In the end things started to become normal, even though some mourned the loss of their family members, some wept over the loss of their homes, and many were enraged by the loss of power. Yet, life continued. Stores, work-places, and schools reopened and the election was held. People restored the peace. They reached to help each other by donating things, offering shelter, and showing kindness. I hope this will be a sign to *all* people to forget their hard feelings for one another, repent, and appreciate the God-given chance to live once again. I hope people become selfless, understanding, caring and loving. It is times like these that we are awed by humanity and times like these that bring us closer to one another and God. Tempests and hurricanes may blow us over and knock us down, but unlike trees, we will slowly be able to stand again.
